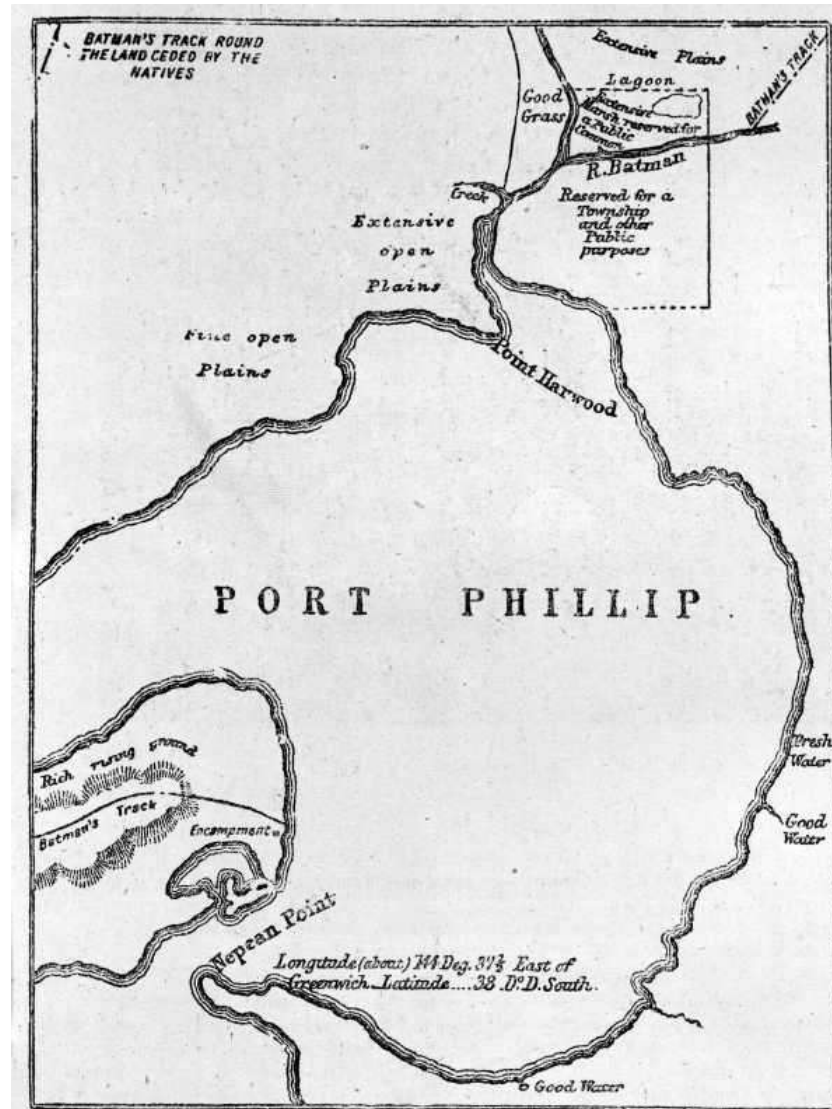

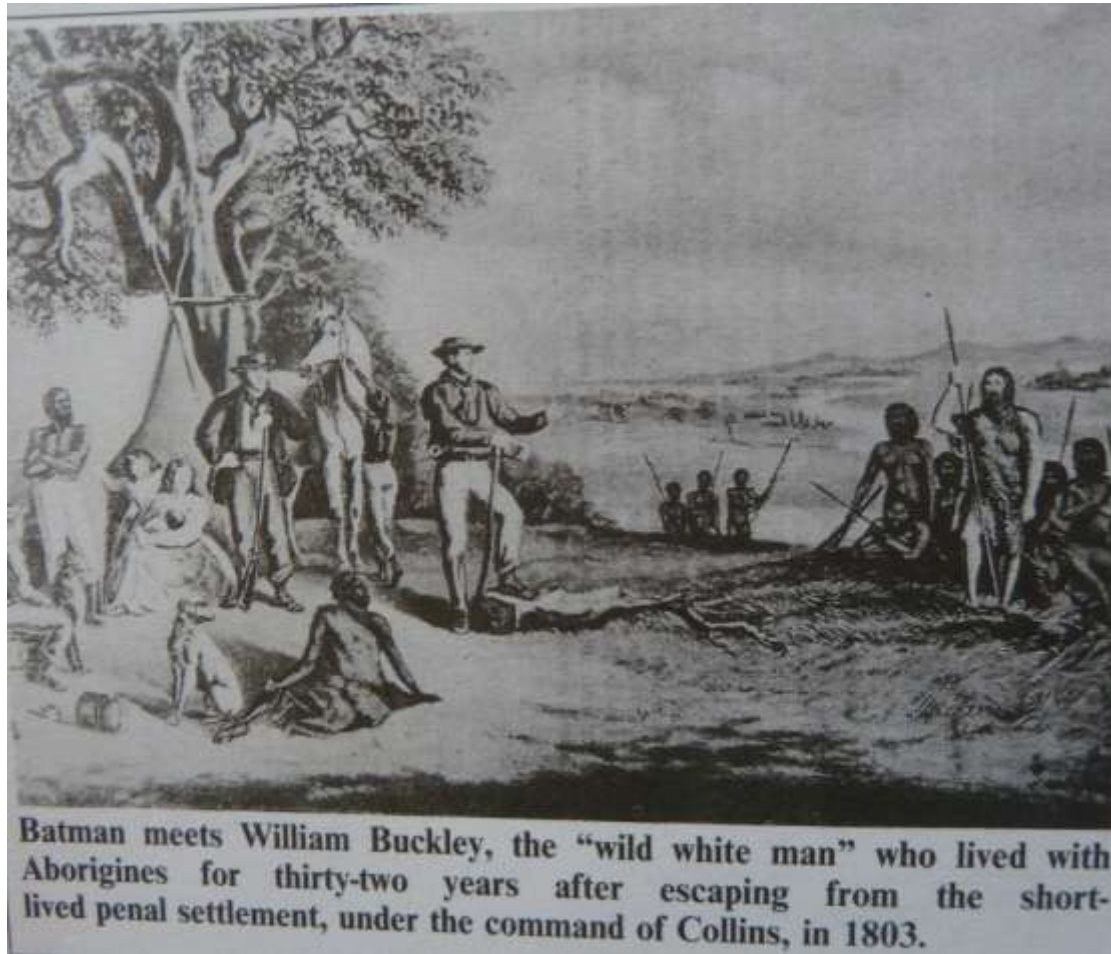
Earliest Map of the Bay

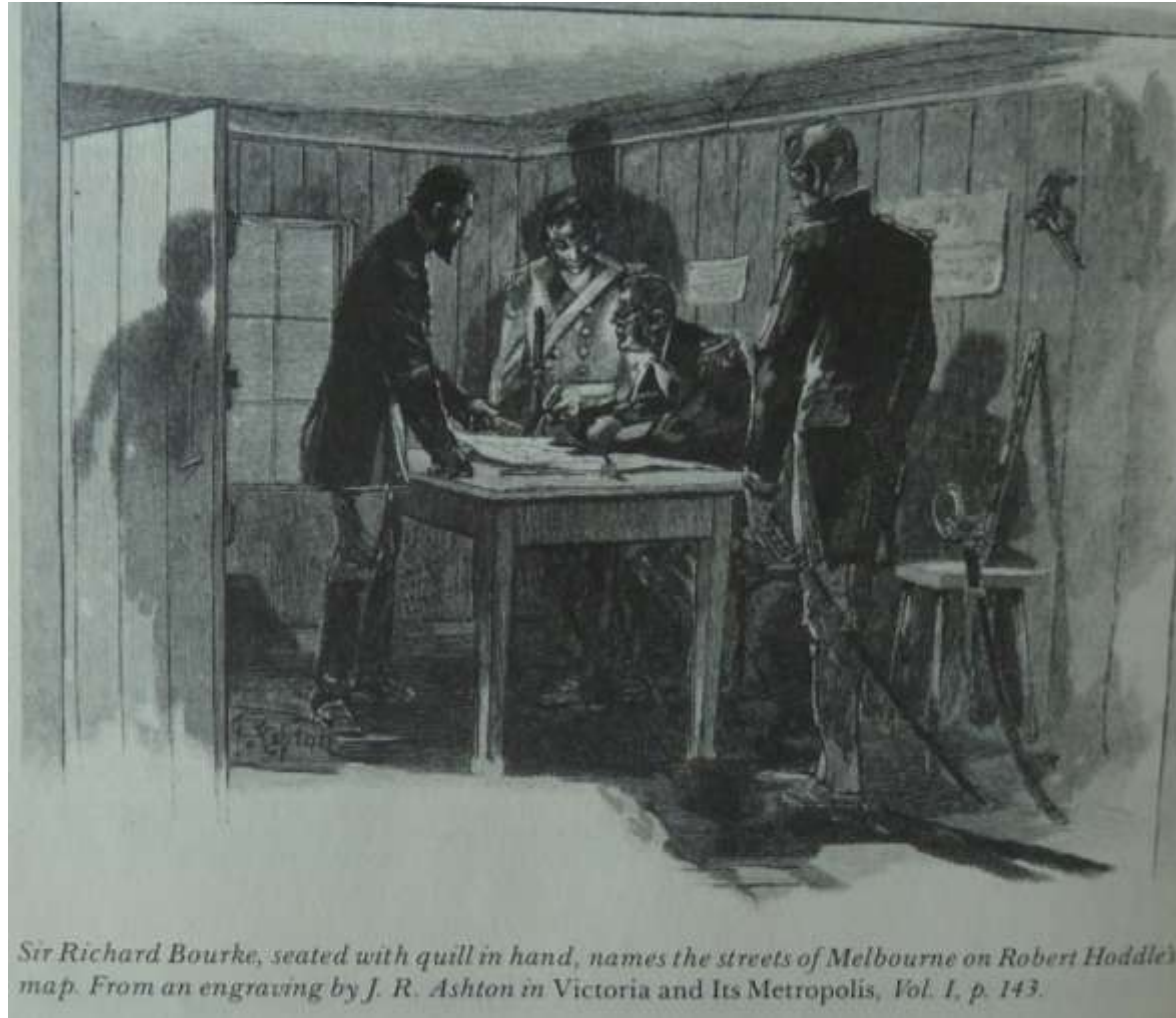
Batman's Hill 1837

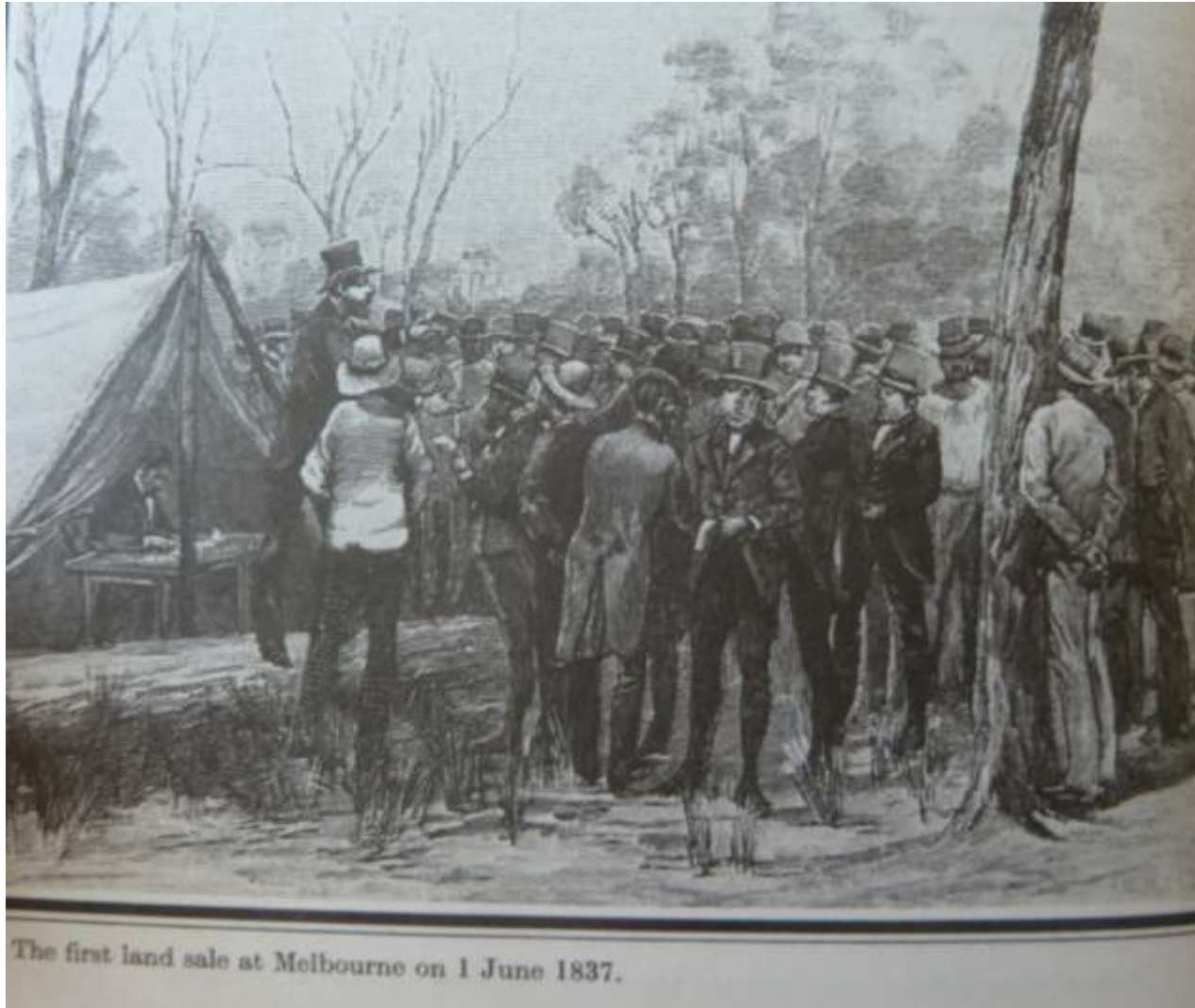

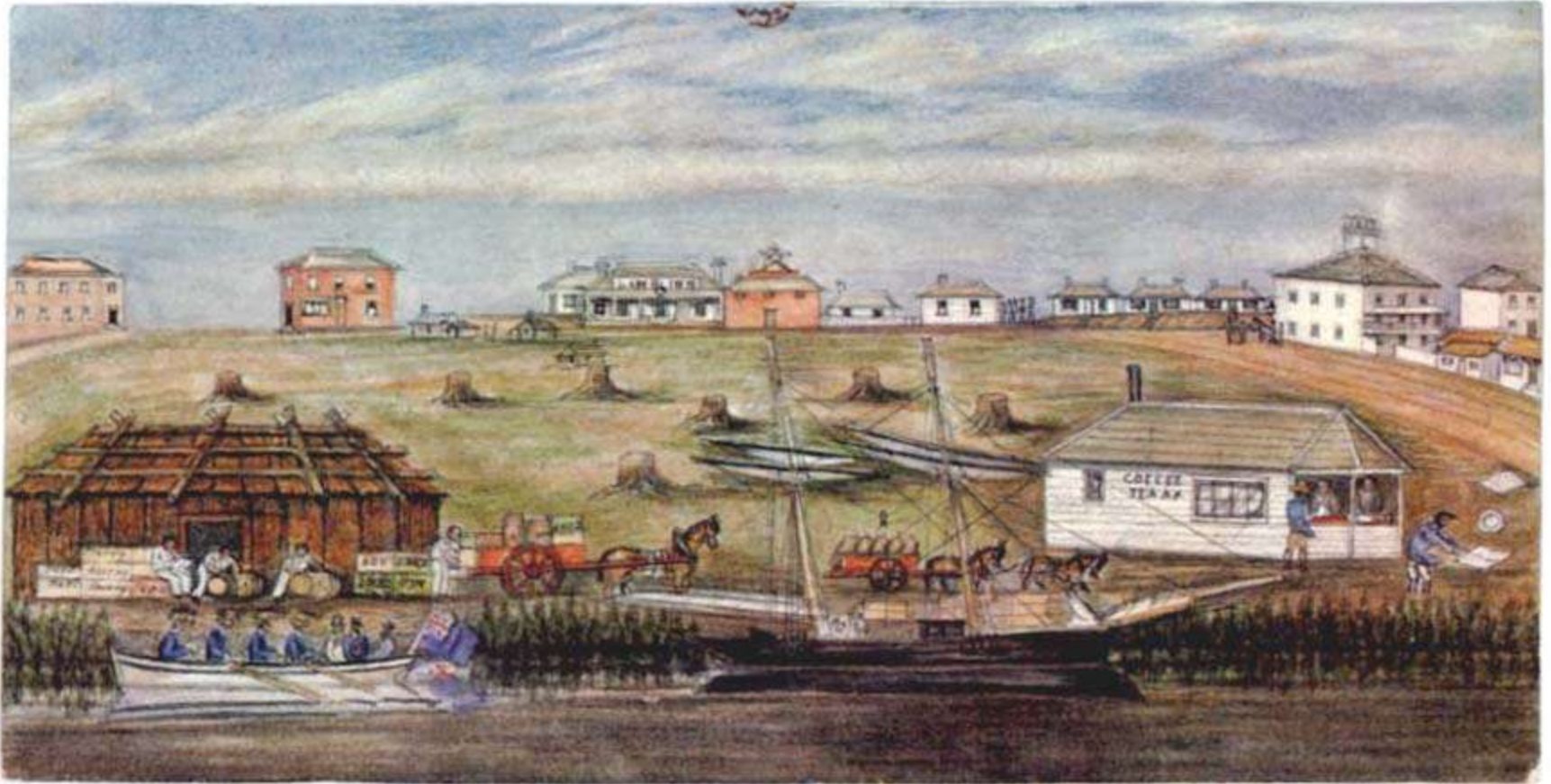

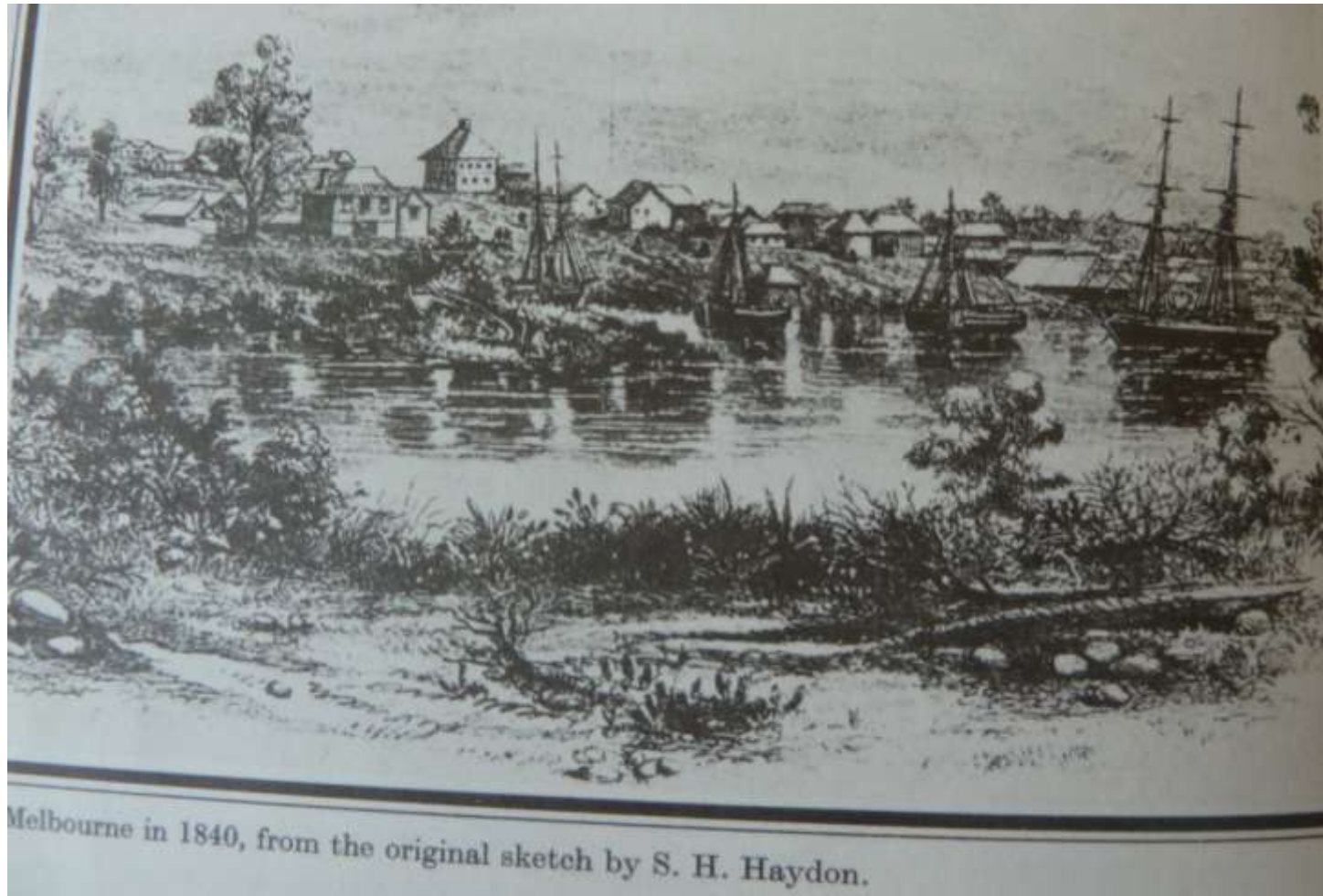
